

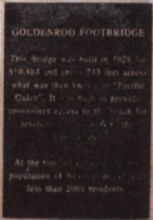

speaking on his new book *The Bolsa Chica Gun Club*. Epting detailed the stories of little-known history making power brokers of late 19th and early 20th century Southern California converging on a private enclave in what was formerly known as Pacific City, now Huntington Beach. Henry Huntington was among the celebrity members of the exclusive club, Bolsa Chica.

Currently, the exhibit in the front gallery of the Balboa Island Museum takes visitors on a romp through the long-gone "Lion Country Safari" park which attracted thousands of visitors over decades in Orange County. Amazing photo images of a giraffe and lions standing beside carloads of shocked and delighted children brings back memories for so many visiting Balboa Island Museum.

Coming up in "Indian Summer," the annual Balboa Island Fun Zone event

and fundraiser, billed as "Cowboy Carnival" will take over the Peninsula Fun Zone October 18th, for a night of sheer western-themed fun.
